



Leaving a gift to Voice of the Martyrs in your Will

Thank you for considering leaving a charitable gift to Voice of the Martyrs in your will. Drafting a will is a very personal matter, and a way to provide for those you love and ensure the assets of your estate are handled appropriately after you are gone.

Wills are important legal documents, and you should consult your lawyer or trust organisation (such as The Public Trust Office) to draft your will or ensure that any changes you want made to your will are legally valid.

What is a Will?

A will is your opportunity to provide instructions as to how you want your possessions to be administered in the event of death.



Why do I need a Will?

- A will gives you the security of knowing that those who depend on you will be provided for.
- A will may prevent conflict and anxiety amongst family and loved ones.
- A will precisely states your instructions and wishes, so your trustees are better equipped to administer your estate the way you intend.
- A will is also an opportunity to make any final charitable gifts you desire, that will continue to bless others long after you have gone.

How do I make a gift to Voice of the Martyrs in my Will?

It is relatively simple to make a bequest for Voice of the Martyrs in your will; however, there are a few points that must be included in the wording of the bequest to ensure that your wishes for the gift are correctly carried out. These include:

- Stating the name of the ministry clearly and accurately - "VOM Ministries" (TA Voice of the Martyrs) and if possible, using our Charities Services registration number CC54131.
- Correctly stating which aspect of the ministry you want your gift to be allotted to. For example; Families of Martyrs fund, General fund, Front line ministry fund, or any other project on our projects webpage. There are many aspects of VOM's ministry to give to, and the staff at the VOM office can assist with your decision on how you want your bequest allocated.



Below are the various ways in which you can include Voice of the Martyrs Limited in your Will:

Residuary

A residuary bequest is a gift of all or a percentage of what is left in the estate after specific gifts, taxes and debts have been fulfilled. Because it is not a specific amount, it maintains its value over time regardless of economic changes and automatically adjusts as the value of your estate fluctuates.

Pecuniary

A pecuniary bequest is the gift of a set dollar amount determined at the time of making your Will.

Specific

A specific bequest is a gift of a particular item of property that can be used by Voice of the Martyrs to generate funds, such as a home, shares or the proceeds of a named bank account.

Perpetual Trust

A gift through a Perpetual Trust. By making Voice of the Martyrs the beneficiary of an endowment fund, you will provide long-term and ongoing support.

If you are planning on drafting a Will

If you are planning to draft a will and you would like to include a gift for Voice of the Martyrs NZ, we have included a sample of draft wording below which you

can copy and use in your will. Please consult with your lawyer or Trust organisation if you have any questions about the wording.

The correct wording for inclusion of Voice of the Martyrs in your will is as follows:

“I give free of all duties to VOM Ministries (CC54131) the sum of \$ _____, (or) _____ % of my estate (or) the residue of my estate (or) property or assets as follows:

_____”

If you already have a will consult your legal advisor regarding adding a “codicil” or amending the will to reflect your desire to give to Voice of the Martyrs.
